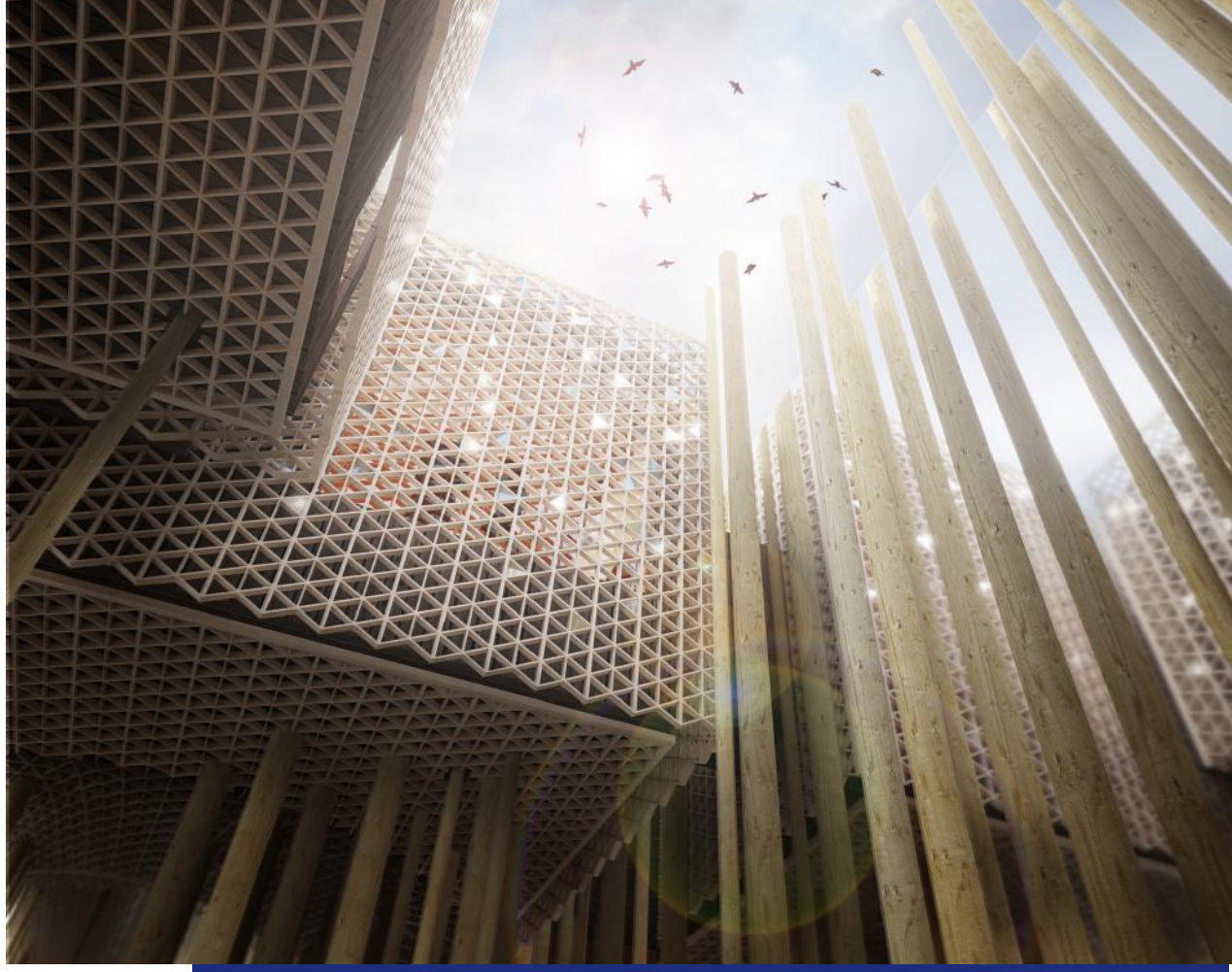

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IVO - Health and Social Care Inspectorate

The Health and Social Care Inspectorate is a government agency which through supervision contributes to make health and social care safe, of good quality and in compliance with laws and other regulations. Its scope of supervision covers more than one tenth of Sweden's GDP.

The agency has about 800 employees organized in two national departments in Stockholm and six regional offices around the country. It carries out inspections of health care services such as hospitals, pharmacies and dentists, as well as blood and tissue services and certain aspects of medical technology products.

In addition to similar supervision of the social care sector, the agency examines permit applications for certain privately provided services in e.g. residential care homes for children or young people, and nursing homes.

Other mandatory tasks include to examine complaints from patients and to answer questions from the public.



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Swecare

Swecare is a unique non-profit platform where academia, public and private sector join forces toward enhanced export and internationalization of Swedish health care and life science.

Swecare was founded in 1978 by the Swedish government and the health care industry together as a semi-governmental non-profit organization. Today, Swecare has more than 100 Swedish companies and organizations in its network. The members represent the entire health care spectrum – from the small startup company to university hospitals, regions, and global corporations, working with everything from biotech to medical technology, pharmaceuticals, and health care services.

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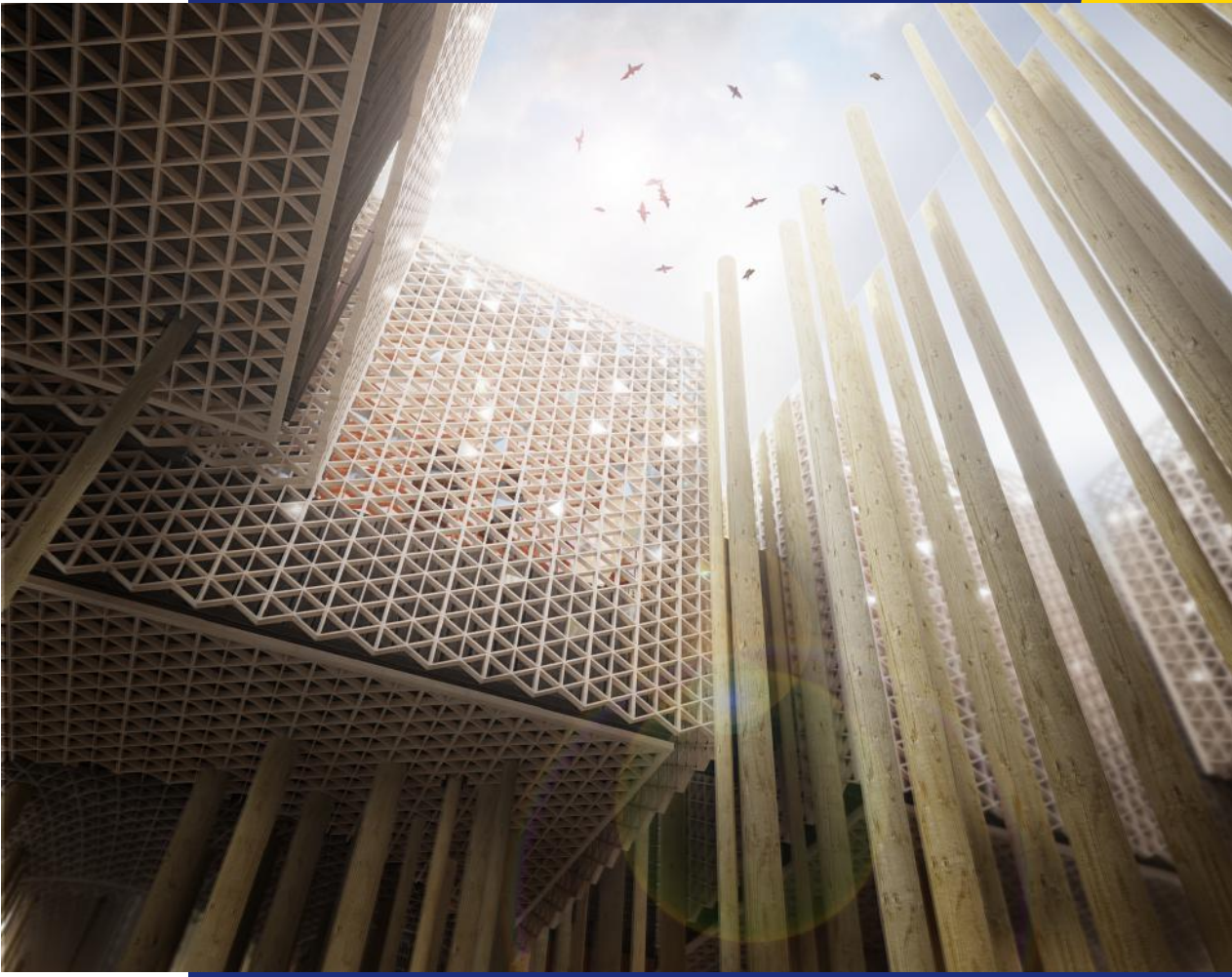
